Week 1 Reports

Premier Division

The new season is now underway. Defending league champions Kenilworth Cons 1st are looking for a third straight title and they got off to a good start with a 6-1 win away at Home Guard 1st, with Ben Deller compiling a 47 break for the champions. In the tie of the opening week, two sides with title ambitions met when Frames 1st hosted Cubbington 1st. A closely fought match saw Sati Viridi (62 break) and Billy Morton (31) compile breaks for the hosts, but it was last season's runners up Cubbington who came out winners 4-3. Priors 1st will be hoping for a better league season this year following their Stan Ward Cup triumph last season. They began the season well with a 6-1 home win over Warwick Cons 1st, with Jason Harvey compiling a 31 break for Priors. Nelson 1st will also be hoping to push for the title this year, and they are up and running with a good 5-2 win away at Lillington 2nd.
