

Warwickshire Beer Leamington & District Snooker League

Nelson 1st returned to the summit of the Warwickshire Beer Premier Division following a 5-2 home win over Lillington 1st. Leaders before play Priors 1st remain unbeaten, but are now second after letting a 3-0 lead slip, eventually winning 4-3 away at Lillington 2nd. Frames 1st continued their pursuit of the top two with a convincing 6-1 home win over Warwick Cons 1st. Harbury 1st gained an excellent 5-2 win away at in-form Home Guard 1st and Frames 3rd bounced back from two consecutive defeats to win 5-2 away at Kenilworth S&S F/C. Frames 4th won for the first time this season, a 5-2 success over fellow strugglers Nelson 2nd lifting them off the bottom of the table. The match between last season's top two sides Kenilworth Cons 1st and Cubbington 1st has been postponed until a later date. Harbury 2nd are now a massive 9 points clear at the top of the A Division table after comprehensively defeating second placed Lillington 3rd, who now slip to fourth. Warwick Cons 2nd won 5-2 at home against Cubbington 2nd to move into second place in the table. Frames 2nd are third despite a 5-2 defeat at the hands of Bishops Tachbrook and Home Guard 2nd won a tight match 4-3 against Priors 3rd. The bottom two sides clashed as Priors 2nd hosted Oakhouse. It was Priors who came out on top with an excellent 6-1 victory. Nelson 3rd returned to winning ways with a 6-1 home win over in-form Lillington Bowls and Kenilworth Cons 2nd won 4-3 at home to Leamington Liberals.
