

## Warwickshire Beer Leamington & District Snooker League

Frames 1st returned to the top of the Warwickshire Beer Premier Division with a 7-0 whitewash of 5 man Kenilworth S&S F/C, who are now 3 points adrift at the bottom. Billy Morton compiled a 44 break for Frames. They are one point clear of Priors 1st, who returned to winning ways with a 6-1 victory away at Nelson 2nd. Dave McLoughlin was in excellent form, knocking in a 38 break before an unlucky in-off on the black denied him a 54 break, settling for a 47 instead. Kev Robinson also compiled a 30 break. Cubbington 1st continued their excellent form with a 5-2 defeat of Nelson 1st, who were the league leaders going into the match. Kenilworth Cons 1st were 6-1 winners over Lillington 2nd. The champions were denied a 7-0 whitewash by Terry Heritage who won an hour long frame against Mark Hanlon. Frames 3rd came out on top in their derby match against Frames 4th 6-1, with Adam Prewett compiling a 33 break for the 3rd side. Breaks from Dave Simmonds (35) and Harj Dhesi (34) helped Home Guard 1st to a 4-3 win over Lillington 1st and Harbury 1st won 4-3 at home to Warwick Cons 1st. Terry Robinson maintaining his 100% record with a 50 break in his frame win.

In the A Division leaders Harbury 2nd extended their lead at the top to nine points with a 6-1 win away at local rivals Bishops Tachbrook, for whom Daz Thorne compiled a 32 break. The Priors derby saw the 3rd side emerge victorious 4-3 in a close match against the 2nd side. Frames 2nd won 4-3 away at Leamington Liberals and Lillington 3rd came out on top 4-3 away at Nelson 3rd. After three defeats in a row, Warwick Cons 2nd returned to winning ways with a 4-3 home win over Home Guard 2nd. Simon Gelfs was on form for the "guard", clearing with a 35 in his frame. Captain Mike Haynes compiled a 40 break for Lillington Bowls, the highest break in the A Division so far this season, but still saw his side go down 4-3 at home against Cubbington 2nd. Martin Hunt also recorded a 32 break for the bowlers. Elsewhere, Kenilworth Cons 2nd won 4-3 at home against strugglers Oakhouse.
